Lunch and Learn: Abraham Joshua Heschel's *The Sabbath* Wednesdays, Bi-weekly, 12:00-1:00pm Starting Oct 18 - ONLINE ONLY

What is Shabbat? What can it mean in our lives today? Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel's classic text, *The Sabbath*, explores the spiritual depths of Shabbat, bringing his rabbinic insights to our modern world. At each Lunch and Learn session, we will read and discuss a chapter of Heschel's teachings.

Making Shabbat Super Fun! Sunday, Oct 22, 10:00-11:00am

There are so many great ways to do Shabbat! Shabbat is not one-size-fits-all, but can be personalized for you and your family. Come learn a variety of ways to create a meaningful, engaging, fun Shabbat experience in your own home.

Challah Braiding Thursday, Oct 26, 7:30-9:00pm ONLINE ONLY

Of all the senses engaged while preparing for Shabbat, nothing is as sweet as the smell of fresh baked challah. Whether you are an occasional challah baker or never baked challah before, learn several techniques for challah braiding and have a fresh loaf of challah ready for Shabbat. This session will focus specifically on braiding; participants must have dough premade.*

Multi-Session Classes

Introduction to Torah Cantillation Wednesdays, 7:00-8:15pm Oct 11, 18, 25, Nov 1, Nov 8, Nov 15

Dating back over 1,000 years, the art of Torah cantillation has helped the community understand the meaning of Torah through music. During this six-week course, learn the basics of Torah cantillation so you, too, can chant Torah. Ability to read Hebrew is required; knowledge of musical notation is helpful.

Beginning Hebrew Mondays, 7:00pm-8:00pm Starting October 16 for 12 sessions

Have you wanted to learn the Hebrew Alphabet, but never had the chance? Do you remember some Hebrew letters, but not all and want a refresher? Learn the Hebrew Alphabet as the first step to learning Modern Hebrew or how to read prayers in their original language. Deborah Coblenz will take you through learning the Hebrew alphabet, a few letters at a time. By the end of the 12 sessions, you will be able to read Hebrew and know some basic Hebrew vocabulary.

Beginning Mussar Starting in November, 7:00-8:30pm Wednesdays, Every Other Week

Looking for a Jewish practice for personal and spiritual growth? David Kleinman will facilitate a *Mussar* (virtue-based ethics) class that might be just what you are looking for.

Shabbat in the Arts Thursdays, 7:30-9:00pm Nov 30, Dec 7, Dec 14

Shabbat is a time for joy, for rest, for sacred time, and for community. All of these have been expressed through Jewish poetry, music, art, and dance. Come explore (and maybe even create!) Shabbat through the creative arts. No artistic ability required or presumed!

Text Beyond Torah Wednesdays, 7:00-8:30pm Feb 7, 14, 21

The diversity of "sacred text" goes beyond the Torah, yet these important sources do not tend to get the same recognition as Torah. In this course, we will explore other sacred texts, including the Hebrew Bible beyond Torah, Talmud, and more. Learn about these sacred texts and how they influence our understanding and practice of Judaism today.
